



Referencing Guidelines

Women's creative work and ideas are all too often stolen, not credited or referenced to the author or founder, and appropriated by men, as well as women. Correct referencing of Rosjke's words and work, and the female writers and theorists learned about in the Training Course is an excellent way of challenging this sexism.

As a community, our values are to act with honesty and integrity in acknowledging the ideas and work of others, and especially all women's work.

Whether blogging, posting to social media, or writing material for publication, key ideas should be referenced, and authorship cited in the text. This includes the following terms that are owned and created by Rosjke Hasseldine.

1. Mother-Daughter Attachment Model
2. Mother-Daughter Coaching Model
3. Mother-Daughter History Mapping
4. Women's Power Circles
5. The Mother-Daughter Puzzle

Attribution is made by explicitly stating who is the author or developer of models, exercises and terms (i.e. Rosjke Hasseldine) and possibly, depending on the publication outlet, include a link to her website or an article. (<https://www.motherdaughtercoach.com/>).

Referencing on your Website
